

## UNIVERSITY OF CAPE TOWN URC POSTDOCTORAL RESEARCH FELLOWSHIPS 2015 CIRCULAR NO. 14/2014

TO: THE EXECUTIVE; ALL DEANS; HEADS OF ACADEMIC DEPARTMENTS; DIRECTORS OF RESEARCH UNITS; CENTRES AND INSTITUTES.

The University of Cape Town URC Postdoctoral Fellowships have been established to encourage excellent doctoral graduates to undertake research and academic training as Postdoctoral Research Fellows at the University of Cape Town in 2015. The Fellowships are based on academic merit and the number and quality of the applicant's peer reviewed publications/scholarly output will be taken into account.

The University of Cape Town invites applications for a <u>limited number</u> of Postdoctoral Research Fellowships to be taken up at the University during 2015.

## Value and tenure:

The value of the Fellowships is fixed at <u>R220, 000 per annum</u> and the awards are tenable for a maximum of 12 months, and include any relocation expenses. The Fellowships carry no benefits and are compliant with the SARS rules for tax exemption.

Applications for renewal <u>for one further year</u> will be considered, but only in competition with new applications. New applications and renewals are not guaranteed and submission of an application does not guarantee an award.

## **Conditions and Eligibility:**

- All South African and foreign candidates are eligible, but preference will be given to applicants who graduated with the
  doctoral degree from universities other than UCT.
- Only applicants who were awarded the PhD degree <u>no earlier than June 2010</u> and who are not yet in academic or research posts are eligible.
- There is no restriction on any particular discipline or field of research, <u>but applications from individuals from other African</u> countries and from women and black researchers will be given preference.
- Applicants who have not yet graduated with the PhD degree must provide proof that the PhD thesis has been submitted by no
  later than 15 September 2014. Such proof must be accompanied by a written statement by the supervisor that the degree is
  likely to be achieved.
- Successful candidates will be expected to undertake the agreed research as well as optional but limited teaching duties as part of professional development; however
- Successful candidates will not be expected to perform any service to the host-department at the University of Cape Town in return for the Fellowship.
- The URC Postdoctoral Fellowship is considered to be a PRIMARY AWARD and cannot be held in full concurrently
  with any other award without the prior consent of the University Research Committee. A maximum of 50%
  (R110,000) of the value of the award can be held concurrently with other postdoctoral fellowship(s) up to the overall
  limit of income from all sources of R350,000.
- It is crucial that applicants' research interests and faculty needs are in line with those of the host department.
- Successful candidates will be expected to produce appropriate scholarly output or publish an appropriate number of papers, as determined by the discipline.
- Successful candidates will be required to enter into a Memorandum of Agreement with the University of Cape Town, and a Memorandum of Understanding with his/her Principal Investigator.
- Successful candidates will be required to comply with the University of Cape Town's approved policies, procedures and practises for the postdoctoral sector.

## **Application procedure:**

Applications must include the following:

- The completed PDOC01 Application Form including all required information and attachments.
- The applicant's full curriculum vitae and a **full list** of publications/research output.
- Reports from three referees, which must be submitted in sealed envelopes.
- Certified copies of all academic transcripts. *Please do not include copies of certificates*.

Although fully completed applications must be submitted directly to the Postgraduate Funding Office, applicants are urged to contact the appropriate Head of Department in the first instance if at all possible. All applicants are subject to the policies, procedures and rules surrounding the postdoctoral sector at the University of Cape Town.

The closing date for receipt of applications is 08 August 2014. Please note that late and/or incomplete applications will be disqualified. Where applicable, proof of submission of the PhD thesis is due by no later than 15 September 2014.

The University of Cape Town reserves the right to make no awards at all; to cancel the award if the conditions are not met, and to effect changes to the conditions of award.
